

## Dr. Don E. Saliers

Dr. Don Saliers is a respected professor and musician. Saliers earned a Bachelor's degree from Ohio Wesleyan, a Bachelor of Divinity and a Ph.D. from Yale University. Dr. Saliers is one of the nations most renown writers on hymnody and music in liturgy. He has served as general editor of *Sounding Glory: Hymns for the Church Year*, and contributes to other publications such as *Today's Liturgy*. Saliers is a retired professor of Theology at the Candler School of Theology at Emory University. Saliers' publications include several joint efforts with his daughter, Emily Saliers of the Indigo Girls, such as *A Song to Sing, A Life to Live* (2004) and *Human Disability and the Service of God* (1998). His own work includes the popular book *Soul in Paraphrase: Prayer and Religious Affections* (1980, 1991).
